



About the Social Sciences and Humanities Library

The Social Sciences and Humanities Library is located in the refurbished Library Duhig Building, winner of a Highly Commended Award in the 1999 Royal Institute of Architects Association awards. A major architectural achievement, the Library Building seamlessly combines two formerly separate buildings into one by means of a "link" construction.

The \$10 million refurbishment was designed by Hamilton Wilson of Wilson Architects and constructed by Barclay Mowlem. It was officially opened by the Queensland Premier, Mr Peter Beattie, in October 1998.

The Library was designed to meet the challenges of new technology, with resources and information available where it is most needed. Upon entering the library, electronic information—via hundreds of computers—is close at hand, and so are the staff, who can be found at three service points: Information, Loans and Returns and the High Use Area.

The Library is also close to other facilities within the building, including the eZone, the AskIT Computer Help and Training service (*for more details see askit.uq.edu.au*), the UQ Graduate School Study Centre and the Fryer Library.

During semester, the Social Sciences and Humanities Library attracts between 5000 and 7000 visitors daily.
