Getting in early and looking for something to do on Thursday?

Investigate the Central Market

Adelaide's Central Market is just next to the Hilton and is famous for its energy and atmosphere. Some of our favourite stalls include:

- Lucia's (best mocha in Adelaide - not to mention the yoghurt shop opposite. Make sure you try their free samples!)
 - T-bar - wide range of teas and great for fast lunches
 - Bean bar - Chai Latte's are smooth teamed with toast spread with peanut butter & jam
 - Doyley's - great muffins
 - Cibo - Adelaide's own Italian coffee mecca
 - Moonta Street Cafe - for cheap Asian meals, in the Chinatown section.
- Opening Hours: Thursday 9-5:30, Friday 7-9pm, Saturday 7-3pm

Catch a tram from Victoria Square to Glenelg Beach

Holiday time is all year round at Adelaide's favourite beachside location! And the best way to get there is on the Glenelg Tram - South Australia's only remaining operating tram service - that runs along Glenelg's Jetty Road and into a cosmopolitan atmosphere of shopping, restaurants, entertainment and amusements that are open every day of the year, with markets every weekend along the foreshore.

Tram leaves Victoria Square approx. every 15 mins. Trip takes 30 mins each way. Your ticket will cost around \$4 and can be purchased from the Tram Conductor or at Adelaide Metro (cr of King William Road and Currie St)

Check out the State Library, Museum, Art Gallery and Bradman Collection

Wander down North Tce, home to Adelaide's many cultural institutions. Cricket fans can see the famous Bradman collection at the State Library of South Australia; check out the treasures in the South Australian Museum; or see the latest exhibitions at the Art Gallery ("Australians in Hollywood" and "Persian Treasures")

Do some shopping down Rundle Mall and Rundle St

A visit to Adelaide isn't complete without a trip to Rundle Mall! Meet a friend at the Malls Balls or Haighs' Beehive Corner. Rundle Mall is Adelaide's main shopping district, including David Jones, Myers and Woolworth's. Continue down to Rundle St for café culture and fashion, as well as the city's Nova and Palace cinemas.

Catch a free bus to historic North Adelaide

Catch the free Adelaide Connector Bus (timetables available at www.adelaidecitycouncil.com) to O'Connell St in North Adelaide. Have lunch at a café, wander through the parklands and check out the Adelaide Oval, one of the most beautiful cricket grounds in the world. Tours of the ground run Tuesday and Thursday 10.00am, Sunday 2.00pm, excluding match days. Tours (including the museum) last approximately 2.5 hours. Adults \$5.00 Children \$2.00

Catch a Popeye to Adelaide Zoo

A visit to Elder Park, off King William Road near the Adelaide Festival Theatre, allows you to take a 35 minute cruise on the launch "Popeye" from the Elder Park landing to the Zoo. A lovely relaxing way to see the superb parklands that surround the River Torrens. One way Adults \$4-00 Child \$2-00. Return Adults \$6-00 Child \$3-00 Or do it under your own steam - paddle boats are available for hire to paddle along the river or hire a bike to ride along the River Torrens. The River Torrens Linear Path is a green pathway along the banks of the Torrens River that runs from the sea into the hills. This pathway is perfect for walking, jogging and cycling.
